

## Child Development



One in 7 children aged 36-59 months attending early childhood education programme

One in every 11 households have three or more children books



Three in every 5 households have two or more types of playthings

1 in 3 mothers believes that a child needs to be physically punished

Birth of about 2 in 5 children under-five is registered

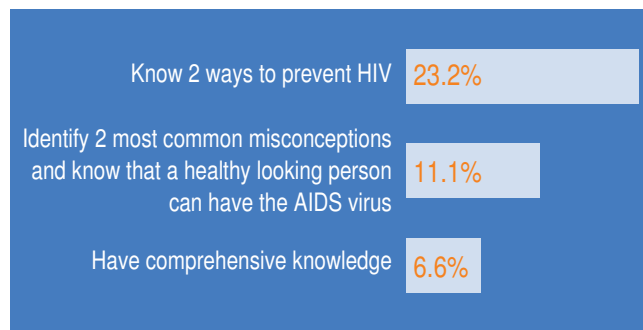

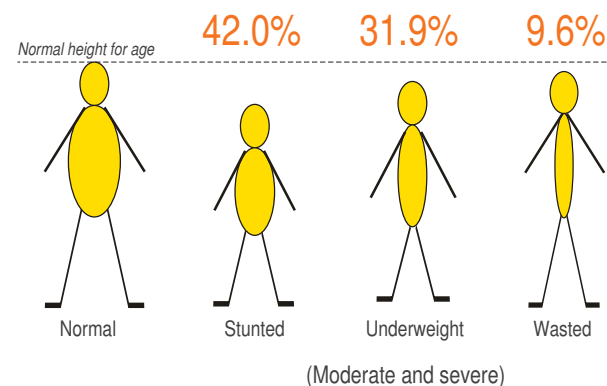

# BANGLADESH MICS 2012-2013 Survey findings

## Nutrition

Under-five undernutrition status



### Stunted

- 52.8% in poorest and 27.0% in richest households
- 51.4% of children to mothers with no education and 23.3% with secondary or higher

Children 48-59 months underweight: 42.3% more than younger children of 0-5 months 25.6%

## Breastfeeding



57.4% breastfed within 1 hour



56.4% children 0-5 months exclusively breastfed

## Drinking Water



97.9% population using improved drinking water source  
5.7% piped water into dwelling



### Drinking Water Quality

12.5% source water contaminated with arsenic over 50 ppb

- Education of household heads (HH): 12.7% with no education and 11.6% secondary or higher
- 12.4% in poorest and 11.1% in richest
- Urban 6.8% and rural 14.0%

– Poorest: 26.5%; Richest: 72.8%

Institutional delivery: 31.0%

– Urban: 49.8% and Rural 25.9%

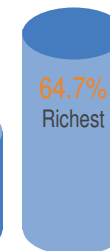
